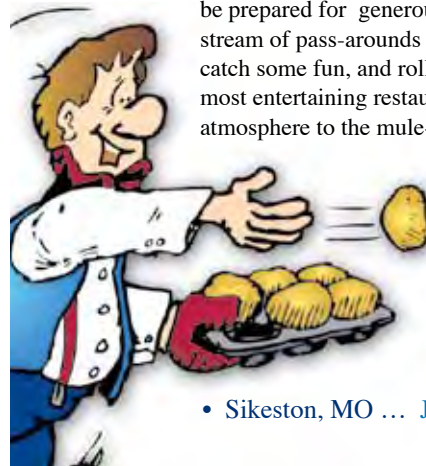

## PARKS AND RECREATION

Sikeston is home to 15 parks offering a wide variety of play-ground equipment, sports facilities, and picnic pavilions. To reserve facilities or obtain additional information contact Sikeston Parks and Recreation at 573-475-3725.

**American Legion Park (Legion Square)** – This park is nestled in Historic Downtown Sikeston. It is the site for many community activities. Malone Ave. at N. New Madrid St.

**Malone Park** – Also located in Downtown Sikeston, Malone Park is one of the community's oldest parks having been established in 1906. It's 1912 Bandstand has been restored and hosts the June live music series "Music at the Malone". Outdoor weddings are also held at this location. Playground and limited picnic facilities are available. Scott & North Streets



**R. S. Matthews Park/C.P. Wing Lake** – Features a 7-acre fishing lake with boat ramp (no gas motors allowed), walking track, picnic shelter, and playground equipment. This 26-acre tract is located on the east end of Col. George E. Day Parkway.

**Recreational Complex** – This 196-acre tract is the City's most complete outdoor recreational facility offering a large selection of playground equipment including equipment for handicapped children, a tot lot for preschool children, four lighted tennis courts, two sand volleyball courts, horseshoe pits, six soccer fields, a Little League football field, four lighted Little League baseball fields, three unlighted T-ball fields, four lighted softball fields for men, women, and girls' programs, a lighted Junior Babe Ruth baseball field, two asphalt basketball courts, a 4.6 acre fishing lake that is stocked periodically during the year with catfish, a half-mile fitness trail with nine exercise stations with security lights, eight picnic shelters with charcoal grills, drinking



fountains, picnic tables, rest room facilities, concession stands, and skatepark. The Clinton Community Building is also located within the Recreational Complex. N. Ingram at Campanella

**Roberta Rowe West End Park** – Covering 7.82 acres this park includes a lighted softball/baseball field, two lighted basketball courts, one unlighted basketball court, a picnic shelter with charcoal grill, drinking fountain, picnic tables, modular playground unit, swing set, rest room facility, and a quarter-mile walking trail. South end of Alabama St. and Sunset Dr.

**Rotary Park** – This 11.5 acre park is the City's most popular spot for family reunions, church picnics, and company picnics. It features three picnic shelters, charcoal grills, picnic tables, drinking fountains, a rest room facility, playground equipment, horseshoe pits, a lighted softball field, and two sand volleyball courts. North end of Industrial Dr.

**Veteran's Park** – This 4.8 acre park is dedicated to area veterans. It features a large, lighted granite monument and flag display. A brick walk leading from the parking lot to the memorial is inscribed with the names of veterans from the Sikeston area. Of special interest to visitors are the M-60 battle tank, an F4 Phantom jet, a 105mm Howitzer from WWII, a U.S. Navy 1955 Sioux Helicopter, a World War II destroyer anchor, and a monument erected in honor of the Army National Guard soldiers of Charlie Company, 1140th Engineer Battalion for service in Iraq. Linn and Industrial Dr.

**VFW Memorial Stadium** – This lighted baseball facility sits on 7.14 acres. The stadium features grandstands with aluminum bleachers with handicapped access, a rest room / concession stand, dugouts, a lighted scoreboard, batting cage, shaded press box, picnic tables, and a dressing room building. This is the home field for Sikeston's high school, Legion, and Jr. Legion baseball teams. Malone Ave. at Mitchell St.
